Evangel Mission Statement

OUR BELIEFS

Jesus: Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all men by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to heaven and will return again to reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit is equal with the Father and the Son as God. He is present in the world to make people aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every believer from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. The Christian seeks to live under His control daily.

Salvation: Salvation is God's gift to you if you'll accept it. We can never make up for our sin with self-improvement or good works. It is only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness that you can be saved from sin's penalty. Eternal life begins the moment you receive Jesus Christ into your life by faith.

The Bible: The Bible is God's Word to all people. It was written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the ultimate source of truth for Christian beliefs and living.

Humanity: Humanity is made in the image of God. Although God designed us to have fellowship with Him, we became alienated from God through disobedience. PRAYER TEAM EXPECTATIONS

PURPOSE: Lead and communicate the ministry vision by praying for people's needs and ministering to people's life situations through anointing with oil, the laying on of hands, and praying for people's specific needs in our services.

Competency Requirements

- Be a dedicated follower of Jesus
- Attend Discover
- Currently serve in a ministry 1/month
- Committed to attend one weekend service
- Prayer Team online training process approved

Roles

Communication and Connection

- Attend Welcome Team Rally
- Remain available for assistance as long as people are still seeking God and prayer.
- Understand when to filter people toward our Care Department for more care
- Respond to serving requests via Planning Center
- Be available for meetings

Build Teams and Assimilation

- Build your team by adding new team leaders (captain)
- Create a culture of team building (all team members)
- Train new team leaders through online training process (captain)


Leader Oversight and Shepherding

- Provide ministry and accountability to those attending the course (all leaders)
- Pray for prayer team members regularly (all leaders)
- Provide leadership oversight to team leaders (captain)

Ministry Task

- Facilitate adding new participants in CCB (captain)
- Communicate with the pastor when making Care Department referrals (captain/leaders)
- Pray over weekly prayer requests (all team members)

TEAM STRUCTURE



Community Life Pastor - Responsible for casting Prayer Team vision, designs and implements strategy, and works with and through Care Coordinator.

Care Coordinator - Articulates and implements vision for the Prayer Team, co-designs strategy and effectively implements it, works through Prayer Team captain and leaders.

Prayer Team Captain - Works with the Care Coordinator with Care Department referrals. Contacts other team leaders to communicate prayer team details and needs. The captain will facilitate relationship, accountability, scheduling requests, and appreciation of other team leaders.

Prayer Team Leaders - Facilitates praying with team members after check-in, 15 minutes before the service starting time. Reports to the Prayer Team Captain. They also do orientation with new team members.

Prayer Team Member - Responsible for praying for people's needs and ministering to situations. Reports Care Department referrals to Prayer Team Leaders. Completed prayer team training process and was approved by the Care Coordinator.

The Evangel Care Department includes:

- Benevolence
 - Help in financial situations
- Care Coaches
 - One-on-one lay counseling
 - We also have a list of local licensed counselors Evangel recommends
- Prayer Team
 - Fill out a "prayer request" card and we'll pray for you throughout the week!

WHO WE'RE LOOKING FOR

The Character Traits

Compassionate: Express love through being sincere to others. Allow others to feel welcome, comfortable, and free to share their thoughts and feelings. Overall, gently point others toward God and His direction for their lives. (Philippians 2:1-4)

Others-oriented: Driven by a genuine concern for others and an eagerness to serve, understanding that it will sometimes be a sacrifice. (1 John 3:17 and James 2:14-17)

Empathetic: Bring a spirit of God's peace and hope (without expressing false optimism), while being patient and respectful to any feelings of discouragement and sadness they may have. (Romans 12:15)

Integrity: Live a moral life both in private and in public. (Psalm 26:11-12)

Humble: Showing a modest or low estimate of one's own importance in the power of prayer. We are merely the vessels that God has chosen to perform His work through, nothing more! Give credit where credit is due: to God only!

Faith: Have confidence that God wants to act in His children's lives. (Hebrews 11:1)

The 'Musts'

Discretion: Be respectful of those in need by not gossiping about the lives of others. Holding oneself to a high standard of confidentiality. (Matthew 6:1-4)

Accountability: Must support Evangel, embracing its key values and policies. As you help others, you're an extension of Evangel and a representation to the community.

The 'That'd Be Greats'

Experience: Have lived through trials and struggles, experienced God's help and healing, and have an intimate understanding of the needs of someone who is hurting. Have a special sensitivity as you interact with people. (1 Corinthians 1:3-4)

WHO AM I PRAYING FOR?

New Believer

1. Pray Salvation Prayer. See “Salvation Prayer” Training Video
2. Fill out Connect Card. If they haven’t already, walk them to the Connect Center to fill out a Connect Card or have them fill out a card with you. They are located in the seatback in front of them or in the prayer boxes under the seats in the front row. After filling it out, drop it in a giving box located on the walls as you exit the auditorium.
3. Give them a “What Now?” card and a “Water Baptism” card. These will be located in the prayer boxes under the seats in the front row.

New Guest

1. Ask if they are a New Believer
 - If they are a new believer, see “New Believer” section above
2. Walk them to the Connect Center

Does the person you are praying with need more care?

1. They can call the church and ask for more information. Phone number: 701-255-0500.

WHEN TO PRAY?

Come up to the front of the auditorium when the worship team begins their closing song, or if the pastor says something to the effect of “Please Stand.” If both the pastor and host forget to call prayer team members up to the front, please walk to the front after the host does his/her closing words. This will be near the end of the service.

HOW TO PRAY?

FIRST | Partner up Pray with another Prayer Team member.

- Married - You may stand with your spouse.
- Not married, or when spouse is not present - You may stand with someone of the same gender (if possible) and pray in a pair.
- Pray individually - If many people come up for prayer, we may ask you to pray alone in order to be more effective for people's needs.

SECOND | Introduce yourself Let the person explain their prayer request by prompting them. (Example: "How can I pray for you today?")

- Ask questions only to clarify your understanding of their need.
- You are not their counselor. (Please refer "extra-grace" individuals to call the church). If someone goes on and on explaining their needs, gently stop them and reassure them saying something like, "God knows everything you need, and He provides for all of our needs; let's invite Him into our conversation and trust Him to move. Let's start to pray now."

THIRD | Laying on of hands Ask to lay your hand on the person's shoulder. (You may hold their hand if you ask first and are of the same gender).

- Speak at a volume in which they can hear you. (If praying in partners, you can decide to have one person pray or have both people pray due to the Holy Spirit's prompting.)
 - If they ask to step out of the auditorium because they are struggling to hear you, kindly remind them that you are expected to remain at the front of the auditorium.
- Although there is no "set" time frame, please keep the interaction with each prayer request to about 5 minutes. This time frame starts with the person explaining their prayer request until they walk away. Let the Holy Spirit guide you.
- Do not share details with others.

PRAYER SUPPLIES

PRAYER BOXES

Located toward the front of the auditorium on the right and left sides of the stage.

What is in the prayer boxes?

- **Lanyards**
 - Please wear a lanyard while serving on the prayer team.
 - They can be picked up at the check-in station or found in one of the boxes under the seats in the front row of the auditorium
- **Connect Cards**
 - All new believers or first time visitors need to fill one out if they haven't already. Have them mark "I accepted Jesus today" if they fill it out with you.
 - Place them in any of the drop boxes, or connect new visitors/believers to the Connect Center.
- **Water Baptism Cards**
 - If you just prayed a salvation prayer with someone, their next step is water baptism. So, give them this card and encourage them to text "eBaptism" to 77411.
- **What Now? Cards**
 - This card is also for new believers. It gives people practical next steps after they have accepted Jesus.
- **Care Department Cards**
 - For those who need more assistance- remember we are not counselors, we are there to pray for individuals and direct them to the care team.
- **Anointing Oils**
 - See "Anointing Oils" Training Video
- **Mints**
 - Please eat a mint before praying with others
- **Pens**

A NOTE ON CONFIDENTIALITY

Please remember that all prayer requests are to be kept confidential.

We are here to be a non-biased person that stands in the gap for people's spiritual needs. We are not here to learn information and gossip about it later.

Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.

Immediate or Extreme Trials

If you are concerned about a person and feel they may need extra help other than what you have given him/her, please talk to the Prayer Team Leader to make sure appropriate action steps are taken.
